First Scripture Reading— Psalm 51:1-12

Second Scripture Reading— II Samuel 12:1-9

¹and the Lord sent Nathan to David. He came to him and said to him, "There were two men in a certain city, the one rich and the other poor. ²The rich man had very many flocks and herds. ³but the poor man had nothing but one little ewe lamb that he had bought. He brought it up, and it grew up with him and with his children; it used to eat of his meager fare and drink from his cup and lie in his bosom, and it was like a daughter to him. 4Now there came a traveler to the rich man, and he was loath to take one of his own flock or herd to prepare for the wayfarer who had come to him, but he took the poor man's lamb and prepared that for the guest who had come to him." ⁵Then David's anger was greatly kindled against the man. He said to Nathan, "As the Lord lives, the man who has done this deserves to die; 6he shall restore the lamb fourfold because he did this thing and because he had no pity." ⁷Nathan said to David, "You are the man! Thus says the Lord, the God of Israel: I anointed you king over Israel. and I rescued you from the hand of Saul; 8 gave you your

master's house and your master's wives into your bosom and gave you the house of Israel and of Judah, and if that had been too little, I would have added as much more. ⁹Why have you despised the word of the Lord, to do what is evil in his sight? You have struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword and have taken his wife to be your wife and have killed him with the sword of the Ammonites.

After graduation, he spent a year as a mission assistant in the interior of Brazil, and then returned to the United States to attend Pittsburgh Theological Seminary.


During his more than forty years in ministry, he served three different congregations in Pennsylvania and Michigan. His active ministry culminated in the role of Senior Pastor at the Rosedale Gardens Presbyterian Church in Livonia for two decades, where he was awarded emeritus status upon his retirement in 2009.

At the request of the presbytery, he left retirement to assist the Faith Community Presbyterian Church in Novi as their Supply Pastor during 2019-2020.

He is certified as both a pastoral counselor and a police chaplain, and was the recipient of special a commendation from the Michigan State Police.
